



Can You Change an Aer Lingus Flight Booked with Chase Points?

If you booked your Aer Lingus ticket using Chase Ultimate Rewards points (usually through the Chase Travel portal), your booking is typically treated like a standard paid ticket. That means:

- Changes are **possible**, but not always free
 - You must follow the **airline's fare rules**
 - Additional fees or fare differences may apply
-

How to Change Your Aer Lingus Flight

1. Check Your Booking Details

Start by reviewing your reservation in your Chase Travel account or confirmation email. Look for:

- Fare type (Economy, Business, Saver, etc.)
 - Change or cancellation rules
 - Any restrictions on your ticket
-

2. Contact Chase Travel or Aer Lingus

For most point bookings, you usually **can't modify the flight directly with the airline**. Instead:

- Go to your **Chase Travel portal**
 - Or contact Chase customer support
 - They will coordinate with Aer Lingus on your behalf

3. Pay Any Required Fees

Depending on your fare:

- You may need to pay a **change fee**
- You may also need to cover any **difference in fare price**

- Some premium fares may allow free changes
-

4. Confirm Your New Flight

Once the change is processed:


- You'll receive an updated itinerary
 - Make sure all details are correct before your new travel date
-

Important Things to Know

- **Reward bookings are not always refundable**
 - Some Aer Lingus fares are **non-changeable or have strict rules**
 - Changing your flight may require **rebooking at current prices**, which can be higher
 - Policies may differ depending on your route (especially transatlantic flights)
